Exploring the Migrant Experience

Presenter: Craig Rhodes

Presentation Summary:

Craig provided a framework on his proposed research on North Asian Migrant experience starting business in New Zealand.

Background of the study:

In teaching Graduate Diploma (GD) and Post Graduate Diploma (PGD) students, several students have expressed a desire to operate their own businesses as a core part of their migration journey to a successful life in New Zealand.

This anecdotal information poses the question:

Could ICL deliver better/different courses to better match the needs of this type of student?

And in doing so could this represent an opportunity to expand ICL's GD or PGD offerings?

Aim of Study:

It is proposed to undertake a series of research projects exploring the experiences of existing North Asian migrant business owners to better understand the needs and knowledge deficits facing North Asian Migrants when establishing businesses in New Zealand.

Through better understanding these deficits ICL could potentially structure/restructure programmes to, for example, create a programme such as: Post Graduate Diploma in Business: New Zealand Business Operations.

Conflict Management Styles in Diverse Workplace: A Case study in Auckland New Zealand

Abstract

Conflict is an everyday phenomenon that is displayed in all working domains (Brahnam et al, 2005). Rakhim (2010) defined conflict as an interactive process manifested in incompatibility, dispute or disharmony within or between social entities. It is a circumstance that is established when individuals or groups consciously intend to do a common inharmonious acts

concerning their wants, needs or obligations. Disagreement is essential to conflict, which is characterized actively by trying to damage one another (Nicholson, 1992).

This research reports on a case study in Auckland, New Zealand investigating the conflict management styles being used by managers in a multi-cultural diverse workplace. To highlight the distinct features of the human experience, a qualitative phenomenological approach was used. Analytical research was employed utilizing a semi-structured face to face interviews with the key managers of the case study.

The case analysis revealed that all managers in this specific case study tended to utilize similar conflict management styles among their culturally diverse staff members at their workplace. Furthermore, the research identifies the importance of communication and the most common conflict management style used by management for conflict resolution in a culturally diverse work place.

Cooperative Education

With the launch of this new corner, I chose to start the discussion about "Cooperative Education", what does it mean and its benefits on the tertiary education field.

Cooperative education (or **co-operative education**) as defined by Wikipedia is a structured method of combining classroom-based **education** with practical work experience. A **cooperative education** experience, commonly known as a "co-op", provides academic credit for structured job experience.

Ako Aotearoa further explains by stating that Cooperative education takes many forms in New Zealand. However broadly speaking it falls into two general categories. One category is **vocational training**, for example apprenticeships, where the student works in their trade, while undertaking formal training at a training institute, typically a polytechnic, Industry Training Organisation or Private Training Enterprise. The other category is where a **tertiary student as part of their degree** goes out into the relevant workplace, typically over summer break, and documents this experience. The student is assigned a grade for their work and/or report, which forms an essential part of their degree.

I believe that this concept of cooperative education is practiced in ICL Graduate Business School e.g. the Industry Practicum Research Project contained in the Level 7 Graduate Diplomas in Tourism and Hospitality Management, in which the students go through an internship to be able to gain practical experience, after which they write their findings in a research project.

This concept is a win-win for all parties i.e. the students benefit from gaining practical experience and sometimes monetary rewards besides getting training on the job; the employers get to train the employees whom they may choose to offer them permanent jobs afterwards as they get to know the students' capabilities during the internship duration; and finally the tertiary institutes gain through interaction with industry and gaining trust and good reputation.

I am inviting colleagues to share their experiences in relation to this concept adding to the forum of discussion. Perhaps case study research could be conducted on this concept.
